## BON APPETIT!

### Drop-in Salad

- 6 cups fresh broccoli florets
- 1 and ½ cups cubed cheddar cheese
- 1 large red apple, cubed
- 1 small red onion, chopped
- ½ cup red wine vinegarettte dressing
- ½ teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 cup coarsely chopped pecans (optional)



In a large bowl combine the first four ingredients. Add nuts if desired. Combine vinegarettte and lemon juice, drizzle over salad. Toss to coat. Serve immediately. Serves 8 to 10.



### Fluffy Lime Pie

- 1 envelope (.13 ounce) unsweetened lime soft drink mix
- 1 can (14 ounce) sweetened condensed milk
- 1 carton (8 ounces) frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 graham cracker crust (9 inches)

In large bowl, dissolve soft drink mix in milk; fold in whipped topping. Spoon into crust. Cover and refrigerate for 3 hours or until set. Garnish with fresh lime slice.

### Chocolate Éclair Cake

- 1 can prepared milk chocolate frosting
- 1 box graham cracker
- 2 small boxes French Vanilla instant pudding
- 1 8oz. Container cool whip
- 3 and ½ cups milk



Mix pudding and milk until dissolved. Add cool whip and mix well. Line a 9x13 inch pan with a layer of graham crackers then a layer of pudding-cool whip mixture. Repeat the two layers. Add one more layer of graham crackers to the top. Frost with prepared milk chocolate frosting and refrigerate over night. Cut into squares and serve.

# From the Managers...

## Seven-Day Notices

Some of those residents who have received a seven-day notice either for late rent, late water bills or possibility both may not understand what this signifies. This notice gives you seven days in which to pay the full amount of what you owe. If it is not paid within that period, it is then turned over to our attorneys and court costs are automatically added on at that point. Although we sympathize with people who have fallen on hard times, when you make no effort to contact us at the office and try to make some type of arrangements and instead choose to ignore us we have no other recourse than to proceed with court dates.



## Pets

Due to the fact that so many people having pets are choosing to ignore the write-ups on picking up their dog waste in their yards, we will now only do one write-up to that effect. If it is not taken care of after the one write-up, we will issue a fine to the pet owner. If this doesn't work we will have no choice but to have you remove your pet permanently from the premises. This is not only an eye sore but a health hazard to other residents.



## Parking

We are noticing quite a few residents and their guests are parking on their lawns. Please refrain from doing this. You are killing the sod and it will become your responsibility to replace it. There also is no on street parking so you must have your guests park in the parking lot by the clubhouse and transport them to your home. There are three parking spots per household, therefore should only be three vehicles per house unless you have a garage.



## Access Cards

We are still waiting for our security company to complete the clubhouse access control system. We appreciate your patience. As the system is complete, we will be calling each resident to set up a time to come in to have their photos taken. Each resident over the age of 14 who wishes to use the facilities must have an access card. The cost for this card is \$5.00. Lost cards will be replaced at a cost of \$25.00. Access cards will allow all residents 14 years and older to use the pool, and those 18 years and older to use the fitness center. Residents 16 and 17 years of age will be



allowed to use the fitness center with a parent or legal guardian. In order to receive an access card, both pool and fitness center liability waivers must be signed. Sharing of access cards is strictly forbidden. Security cameras are in place to ensure that only approved residents use the facilities. Anyone caught sharing or letting non-approved residents or guests into the facilities will lose their privileges for 60 days. In addition, those residents whose accounts are not in good standing will not be able to get access cards or will have their cards deactivated until accounts are made current.

## New Playground

As many of you may have noticed, we are in the process of installing a new play structure behind the clubhouse. Construction will take place Monday, May 10<sup>th</sup>, and Tuesday, May 11<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 A.M. both days. Any residents looking to lend a hand, please give the office a call at 517-540-9500.
